BILLING AND ACCOUNT SUMMARY

Students are Billed on a semester bases. You can view your CUA billing summary at any time by logging into your *Cardinal Station*. The following is an example of typical charges you may see each semester.

* Part time Tuition is \$1,445 per credit. Typically a first year student takes 10 credit hours in the Fall semester and 11 credit hours in the Spring.

** Law Fee is applied to the student's first semester every academic year; usually in the Fall semester.

*** 1yr plan is anticipated to be \$1,500. A Spring semester only plan is estimated at \$1,000. All full time students and all international students are required to have health insurance coverage. You may choose to waive the CUA health insurance coverage if you are covered under another policy. Information regarding waiver procedures is sent to students during the summer prior to enrollment.

Monthly Payment Plans are available to break the educational costs into easy-to-handle monthly payments rather than in one large sum. The monthly payment plan is interest free. You pay only a small enrollment fee to participate. Please visit <http://treasurer.cua.edu/controller/sa/> to enroll.
