* Students in the Cracow program are limited to a maximum of 6 credits. The add/drop deadline for all Cracow courses is two days from the start of the individual course. If you are still interested in applying for the Cracow program, please contact Ms. Constantia Dedoulis at dedoulis@law.edu.

1. Writing Course (WC). Successful completion of this course will satisfy one of the two upper-level writing requirements.
2. Advocacy for the Elderly is a 12-week program. Interested students must fill out a separate application in the CCLS office prior to or at the time of registration. Evening students have priority in this course and visitors may enroll only with the approval of the faculty supervisor.
3. If this is your first externship at the Law School, you must sign up for both Becoming a Lawyer and Legal Externship. If you have already completed an externship at the Law School (and thus have already taken Becoming a Lawyer), you should only register for Legal Externship. All externships must be completed by July 31, 2017. Visiting students are allowed to enroll in the externship classes only with the permission of the Academic Dean of the student's own Law School, our Assistant Dean for Academic Affairs and our Director of Clinical Programs.
4. Student/advising faculty must submit Directed Research form by May 25, 2017. If project is approved by the Associate Dean, registrar will then give student permission to register within Cardinal Station.
5. Limited to 18 students.
6. If you began the J.D. program prior to the Fall 2016 semester, this course meets the Transition-to-Practice and Professional Skills requirements. However, if you are completing a portfolio within the clinic and thereby counting this class towards your upper-level writing requirement, you cannot also fulfill the Professional Skills requirement with this course unless you are taking this class for 6 or more credits. If you began the J.D. program in the Fall 2016 semester or subsequently, this course meets the Transition-to-Practice requirement and a portion, or all (if 6 credits), of the Experiential Learning Requirement. If these same Fall 2016 or later students complete a portfolio within the clinic, this will fulfill one of the two upper-level writing requirements.

7. If you began the J.D. program prior to the Fall 2016 semester, this course meets the Professional Skills requirement, but only if you are not using this course to meet the practice-oriented, upper-level writing requirement. If you began the J.D. program in the Fall 2016 semester or subsequently, this course meets one of the two upper-level writing requirements and 3 credits of the Experiential Learning Requirement.
8. Selected students only.
9. This is an “online” Becoming a Lawyer class. There will not be a weekly meeting at the Law School.
10. Students who are in their second or greater externship (for credit) do not take Becoming a Lawyer. However, these students are required to attend “in-person” meetings with Law School supervised fieldwork instructors.
11. Prior to registering for Legal Externship credits, students must complete the on-line Legal Externship Placement Approval Form, located on the following website: <https://law-cua-csm.symplicity.com/>
Once your externship is approved, you will be given permission within Cardinal Station to register for the 2 or 3 credit Legal Externship.
