

Legal Methods Workshop (291)

Through this course, students will develop and improve legal analysis and exam-taking skills. Specifically, the course will provide students with strategies and practice with critical reading, writing analytically, and essay organization, including the IRAC method. The course will reinforce general subject matter content of the doctrinal courses and develop exam-taking skills. This course will teach students to monitor and evaluate their skills so they can continue to progress independently in first-year and upper-division courses and on the bar examination. This course will help students improve time-management and productivity skills such as case briefing, case synthesizing, and properly using study aids. It will be tied to one or more first-year courses. This is a pass/fail course.
