* Students in the Krakow program are limited to a maximum of 10 credits. The add/drop deadline for all Krakow courses is two days from the start of the individual course (e.g. June 13 for a course beginning on June 12). Students must enroll in at least two courses overall, not including the externship program. Students enrolled in the externship program must enroll in Law of the European Union and at least one additional course. Students may enroll in only two of the following three courses: Forced Labor in the Global Workplace, International Intellectual Property Law and International Investment Law. Students in the Legal Externship program must take Becoming an International Lawyer, regardless of whether one has previously taken an externship for credit.

Footnotes

1. Writing Course. Successful completion of this course, with a grade of 'B-' or better, may satisfy one of the two upper-level writing requirements.
2. If this is your first externship at the Law School, you must sign up for both Becoming a Lawyer and Legal Externship. If you have already completed an externship at the Law School (and thus have already taken Becoming a Lawyer), you should only register for Legal Externship. All externship work hours used toward meeting the 120 or 180 hour requirement must be completed by July 31, 2023. Visiting students are allowed to enroll in the externship classes only with the permission of the Academic Dean of the student's own law school and the Assistant Dean/Director of Experiential Learning of the Columbus School of Law.
3. Student/advising faculty member must submit Directed Research form to Registrar by May 22, 2023. If the project is approved by the Associate Dean, the Registrar will then give the student permission to register within Cardinal Students.
4. Limited to 18 students.
5. This course may fulfill one of the two upper-level writing requirements (practice oriented) and 3 credits of the Experiential Learning Requirement.
6. Selected students (selected by the S.E.C.) only. Students participating in a for-credit externship for the first time at the Law School must also simultaneously take the Becoming a Lawyer course.
7. This is an "online" Becoming a Lawyer class. There will not be a weekly meeting at the Law School. However, the professor may schedule an in-class presentation session.
8. Students who are in their second or greater externship (for credit) do not take Becoming a Lawyer. However, these students are required to attend meetings with Law School supervised fieldwork instructors.
9. Prior to registering for Legal Externship credits, students must complete the on-line Legal Externship Placement Approval Form, located on the following website:

Once your externship is approved, you will be given permission within Cardinal Students to register for the 2 or 3 credit Legal Externship.

10. This course may be used to partially satisfy the Experiential Learning Requirement.

11. This course is limited to 6 students and requires registration approval. If interested, please email Stuart Schept (schept@law.edu) as close as possible to, but not before, the beginning of your registration period (8:00 a.m. on March 15th for rising 3D and 4E students; 8:00 a.m. on March 17th for rising 2D, 2E and 3E students). First priority given to evening students. Second priority to students closest to graduation. This course begins on May 23, 2023 and ends on August 3, 2023.
12. This course fulfills the transition-to-practice portion of the Experiential Learning Requirement.
13. With Professor Graw Leary's approval, two to three students may complete a two credit Directed Research project in the following Fall semester (Fall 2023) on an issue related to the course material.
