* Students in the Krakow program are limited to a maximum of 10 credits. Students in the Rome program take a total of 4 credits (two courses). Students in both programs may take up to 10 credits. The add/drop deadline for all Rome and Krakow courses is two days from the start of the individual course (e.g. May 19th for a course beginning on May 18th).

Students in the Krakow program must enroll in at least two courses overall, not including the externship program. Students enrolled in the externship program must enroll in Law of the European Union and at least one additional course. Students in the Legal Externship program must take Becoming an International Lawyer, regardless of whether one has previously taken an externship for credit.

Footnotes

1. Writing Course. Successful completion of this course, with a grade of 'B-' or better, may satisfy one of the two upper-level writing requirements.
2. If this is your first externship at the Law School, you must sign up for both Becoming a Lawyer and Legal Externship. If you have already completed an externship at the Law School (and thus have already taken Becoming a Lawyer), you should only register for Legal Externship. All externship work hours used toward meeting the 100 or 150 hour requirement must be completed by July 31, 2026. Visiting students are allowed to enroll in the externship classes only with the permission of the Academic Dean of the student's own law school and the Director of Experiential Learning of the Columbus School of Law.
3. Student/advising faculty member must submit Directed Research form to Registrar by May 26, 2026. If the project is approved by the Associate Dean, the Registrar will then give the student permission to register within Cardinal Students.
4. Limited to 16 students (maximum of 8 LL.M. students).
5. This course may fulfill one of the two upper-level writing requirements (practice oriented) and 3 credits of the Experiential Learning Requirement.

6. This is an “online” Becoming a Lawyer course. There will not be a weekly meeting at the Law School. However, the professor may schedule an in-class presentation session.
7. Students who are in their second or greater externship (for credit) do not take Becoming a Lawyer. However, these students are required to attend meetings with Law School supervised fieldwork instructors.
8. Prior to registering for Legal Externship credits, students must complete the on-line Legal Externship Placement Approval Form, located on the Externship Information for Law Students website. Once your externship is approved, you will be given permission within Cardinal Students to register for the 2 or 3 credit Legal Externship.
9. This course may be used to partially satisfy the Experiential Learning Requirement.
10. This course is limited to 6 students and requires registration approval. If interested, please email Stuart Schept (schept@law.edu) as close as possible to, but not before, the beginning of your registration period (8:00 a.m. on March 18th for rising 3D and 4E students; 8:00 a.m. on March 20th for rising 2D, 2E and 3E students). First priority given to part-time students. Second priority to students closest to graduation. This course begins on May 26, 2026 and ends on August 6, 2026.
11. This course fulfills the transition-to-practice portion of the Experiential Learning Requirement.
12. The Remedies course is a fully online course. Each Wednesday the class will meet synchronously from 6:15-8:10 p.m. via Zoom. Prior to the Wednesday meeting, students will be expected to complete (asynchronously) the week’s multiple recorded lectures, along with problem sets and quizzes. Students must complete all weekly assignments prior to the Wednesday class session, and attend the Wednesday class session, in order to be credited with attending class for the week. Students who do not complete all weekly assignments, or attend the weekly synchronous class session, will be marked as absent for the week. The course midterm will take place at the Law School on Monday, June 22nd at 6:15 p.m. The final live course session will take place on Wednesday, July 15th, two days after the end of classes for other non-externship, non-clinical summer courses.
