Students have the option to reside at the Rome Center in dormitory style housing. Accommodations are designed to house two, three or four students per room; a very limited number of single rooms may be available at a higher cost. Room preference will be given to students in the order in which they sign the program commitment form on goabroad.cua.edu.

CUA Rome Center Housing Refund Policy:

100% Refund: On or before April 14, 2026, a student who has signed the CUA-arranged housing form may cancel the reservation in writing by emailing the Program administrator Ms. Dedoulis, dedoulis@law.edu. The email must be received on or before April 14th.

0%-No Refund: As of April 15, 2026, no housing refunds will be issued. The housing fee will appear on the student's billing statement, which is generated by CUA Enrollment Services.
